Sunday 25 th April ANZAC Day	Mid- morning Service- 10.30am. All students are invited to participate. Please assemble in front of the RSL Hall at 10.30am in school uniform for our march towards the Cenotaph. We will line the street as a guard of honour for the formal march. Our School Captains and Vice–Captains will participate in the formal ceremony-read the Ode and all four Captains will lay a wreath on behalf of the school community. Selected pieces of student writing (senior school) may also be read at the ceremony by the authors. Our representative students will be chosen in the first week of Term 2.

ANZAC Day Badges are available for sale at School. All proceeds go directly to the RSL.

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Term 1 summary: Our first term of the 2021 school year has been a very busy and productive one! (So very different to Lockdown in Term 1 2020!) We needed to make a few necessary alternations due to the COVID 'circuit breaker' and the follow up rules and restrictions, however our term was 'almost' back to a 'new normal'.

Thank you all for your incredible commitment to our wonderful school, your positivity and to the ongoing learning successes for our students.

This term we have among other achievements:

- Celebrated a very positive start to the year with 104 students enrolled at our school on Census Day. Currently we have 105 students.

- Welcomed Lilly and Ryan as School Captains and Kodah and Zeb as Vice Captains.

- Settled 13 Preps into primary education, all Preps now attending full time!

- Elected House Captains and Junior School Council representatives and conducted weekly Student Leadership Meetings.

- Sought Eco-Crew and Sustainability representatives from across the Senior Unit and we commenced our Kitchen Garden (outdoors) Program. (not the cooking component of the program just yet)

- Registered for Energy Breakthrough 2021!

- Celebrated weekly Students of the Week!

- Established our class and yard rules in line with our School Values and Positive Behaviours approaches.

- Celebrated a Beckworth win in the Senior Swimming Sports but were very proud of all participants! Students also excelled at the Eureka Swimming event and James represented the school in Horsham at the Regional event. 50 metres Butterfly! Go James!

- Completed the 2021 School Council election process. We welcomed for a second term of office; Andy Campbell (Treasurer) as well as new SC representatives: Deb Bright, Zoe Handley, Jaqui Featherston, Shane Hoffmann, Kristin O'Brien and Gill Jedwab (Community representative). We welcomed returning school councillors Steve Kinnersly (President), Jo Henderson-Drife (Vice-President), Vicki Anderson and Malcolm Hull (Community representative).

Rob Anderson will begin his term of office in April.

- All teaching staff members attended multiple professional learning sessions (in-house & external via online platforms), particularly focussed on Professional Learning Communities training outcomes and also including preparing for the NAPLAN online practice session. On the national NAPLAN co-ordinated practice day all students were able to complete their task.

-Our Story Dogs program commenced and we welcomed 'Indie' and her handler Kim weekly to school.

-The Tutor Learning Initiative commenced for identified students (currently across Senior School).

-Mrs B, Mrs Anderson and Miss Dargaville conducted Literacy Partnerships training for new & returning parents.

- 10 students were allocated places for the upcoming Somers Camp 18-26th May.

- Sadly we were unable to fundraise due to the cancelled Historic Vehicle Show! However we have applied for Grants with the Waubra Wind Farm and Rural Arts Victoria. (outcomes unknown as yet)

- Building and Grounds work linked to rectifying drainage and cracking issues were completed. These were managed by the Victorian Schools Building Authority (VSBA) and conducted by Searle Bros.

-9 families gave their all at a Working Bee! Almost all listed tasks were completed. (leaf matter in guttering our next challenge)

- Completed draft #1 of the 2021-2025 School Strategic Plan, Annual Implementation Plan and Annual Report documents in line with Department of Education compliance requirements. All documents are currently being revised by the Department and School Council and will be made public early in Term 2.

- We danced away at our Term 1 Disco! (Thank you to our parent helpers for completing all of the pre-work required for food at the Disco.) Our Student Leaders led magnificently on the night!

- Engaged in 'Harmony Day' focussed activities within mixed ability groupings Prep- Year 6. 12 families visited on the day and actively participated in the activities.

- Ran, jumped and threw our way into success on our P-6 Athletics Sports Day. Thank you to Hepburn Shire, the Clunes Netball and Football Club helpers for enabling us to utilise the Clunes Football Oval for our running events. Thank you to our many volunteers on the day! Letter for parents and carers

Dear parents and carers

The Victorian Government has further relaxed its <u>COVIDSafe settings</u> from 6pm on Friday 26 March 2021.

Changes to the COVIDSafe settings include allowing more visitors in the home, changes to mask wearing in some settings and updates to density limits in some settings. There are limited operational changes for schools.

Visitors continue to be welcomed at our school, however face masks must be carried by individuals 12 years and over at all times and worn when physical distancing of 1.5 metres cannot be maintained.

Individuals aged 12 years and over must continue to wear a face mask when on public transport, school buses (except primary school students) and when in taxis or ride share vehicles – unless they have a lawful exemption.

Thank you for your understanding and support throughout this term as we continue to implement COVIDSafe practices at our school.

I look forward to welcoming our students and families back to more school events in Term 2.
