### Dear Parents/Caregivers,




Welcome back to on-site teaching and learning everyone!

They will give you the link to get enrolled and answer any questions you may have. OR drop over to the hall and chat with Liz or Tanya. It **costs NOTHING** to get enrolled and it's all done online, once enrolled all you need to do is let me know when you require care. **Fees** = Less any childcare subsidy (CCS %) you are entitled to:

**After School** 3pm – 6pm (3 hours + snack) full fee: \$34.05 50% CCS: \$17.87 85% CCS: \$6.55

**Before School** 7am-9am (2 hours) Full fee: \$21.20 50% CCS: \$11.13 85% CCS: \$4.00

**School Holiday Care** 8am- 5.30pm (9.5 hours) Full fee: \$98.33 50% CCS: \$51.62 85% CCS: \$18.93

# **Active to School Passport**

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Clunes Primary School is excited to be participating in the Active to School Passport, facilitated by Central Highlands Rural Health (CHRH). We will be starting this exciting program on Monday 16<sup>th</sup>August after a brief delay!

#### How does it work?

Over the four weeks beginning Monday 9<sup>th</sup> August, families will be encouraged to walk, ride or scoot to school. Each day a student is active to school, they will get their passport ticked off and signed by their classroom teacher. Once a student has been active for at least 16 days, they will receive a Hepburn Shire Active to School Certificate.

What about bus travellers or students driven to school? No matter how your child gets to school they can still actively participate by getting active once they arrive at school – for example, walking a lap around the school oval. (We all do this! ()) If you drive, perhaps park a little further away and walk the rest.

Do you know how much physical activity we should be doing each day? For children aged 5 – 17 years it's recommended they engage in 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity every day, enough to get them huffing and puffing. For adults, the guidelines recommend 30 minutes per day. Being active doesn't need to be done all at once, you could split it up throughout the day.

Getting enough physical activity each day is important for our physical, social and emotional health and wellbeing and helps young people concentrate more. We encourage you to get creative in getting your heart rate up. Take a family bike ride, enjoy a kick of the football or soccer ball at the local recreation reserve or have a dance party in the comfort of your lounge room. Whatever it is, have some fun with it and get the whole family involved!



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## **COVID-19 vaccination update for students**

Dear parents and carers,

As part of the phased COVID-19 vaccination rollout, more Victorian school students are now eligible to receive the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine.

From Monday 9 August, children aged between 12 to 15 years old are eligible to receive a Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine if they:

- identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander
- have a specified <u>medical condition</u>.

People aged 16 years and older continue to also be eligible under these categories, to get a COVID-19 vaccine.

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation will provide further advice on the broader 12-to-15year age group in coming months. As more COVID-19 vaccine doses become available more people will be able to get vaccinated.

The free and safe vaccines being used in Australia are very effective at preventing serious illness and loss of life from COVID-19.

Eligible young people and their parents or guardians should speak to their doctor if they have questions about the COVID-19 vaccine and their health.

Booking an appointment

To book an appointment, visit the coronavirus.vic.gov.au website.

Eligible young people are encouraged to get their COVID-19 vaccine at their doctor's clinic or health care provider. They can also be vaccinated at Victoria's vaccination centres.

What to bring:

Bring a Medicare card (if you have one) that lists your child's name, and information about your child's medical history if they have an underlying medical condition. Please refer to Department Health information on what to bring to your vaccine appointment.

### Free Sanitary Pads and Tampons in all Government Schools initiative

Dear parents and carers,

In an Australian first, the Victorian Government has committed to providing free sanitary pads and tampons in all government schools.

Dispensers providing free sanitary pads and tampons have been installed in every Victorian Government school in the state, including at Clunes Primary School.

Providing free sanitary pads and tampons in schools aims to:

• Provide students with the confidence that there will always be sanitary items available at school



- Relieve students of the stigma, anxiety and discomfort that can be associated with menstruation and its management
- Ease the cost of living for families.

Lack of easy access to sanitary items can negatively affect attitudes, behaviours and equal participation in sport and everyday school activities. Having sanitary pads and tampons available at our school will help students to manage their periods with greater ease and less embarrassment, and will help to normalise periods as a healthy part of growing up.

The use of sanitary products provided at the school is optional. Providing both sanitary pads and tampons in schools allows students to have a choice about what products they use based on preference, maturity and cultural beliefs.

To support this initiative our school will provide information to students about menstruation and safe usage of sanitary pads and tampons.

**Grades F-2:** For younger students, sanitary dispensers and items are likely to be novel. Conversations with these students will include an age appropriate conversation explaining that the sanitary products are for older students. This conversation will go some way in preventing misuse of sanitary items and ensure they remain available for students who need them.

**Grades 3-4:** Menstruation can start as young as 8 or 9. Understanding menstruation before it starts is important to help reduce anxiety and shame. With the provision of sanitary items in school bathrooms, schools must provide students with information about the safe use of sanitary items. An initial conversation will be had with students in Grades 3-4 to explain the purpose of the sanitary dispenser and to provide some basic menstrual hygiene advice. Signage providing health and hygiene information will also be displayed on the dispensing machines.

**Grades 5-12:** Menstruation commonly starts between the age of 11 - 14. The Health and Physical Education curriculum supports students to develop positive practices in relation to the physical, social and emotional changes that occur during puberty. The school will speak to students about the purpose of the sanitary dispenser and the safe and hygienic use of sanitary products. Signage providing health and hygiene information will also be displayed on the dispensing machines.

Parents and carers of students with health care needs are invited to discuss the initiative in their next student support group meeting to consider the most appropriate way your child can access to these products.

# Resourceful Hepburn's survey results and strategic planning

### Great response to our survey

Thanks to the 102 people who completed our recent survey. We've started posting results, one question at a time, on our <u>Facebook page</u>. Some great insights and plenty of community interest about improving how we reuse, repair, repurpose and recycle. Also, many fantastic ideas about how to go about it.

Overall respondents indicated they rated the council's performance in various resource recovery categories rather poorly and overwhelmingly indicated that a community resource recovery enterprise in Hepburn Shire would be an improvement compared with the current situation.

The results also showed that the areas of reuse and repair would be the most beneficial categories of reform for the community to prioritise. It's so great to know our community sees the importance of taking accountability for our own waste! Keep visiting our <u>Facebook page</u> for the full survey results.

### Successful planning day

Many thanks to **Jane Grimwood**, Strategic Facilitator Extraordinaire, who facilitated a Resourceful Hepburn strategic planning session for us last week.

Key outcomes were an agreed approach to formalise the group, communications with the community, and two priorities for enterprise activities – repair, upcycling and sale of useful goods/materials, and, a focus on organic waste, particularly commercial food waste composting and a community chipper.

### Incorporation

Resourceful Hepburn became an Incorporated Association on 4 August 2021, and we thank Hepburn Wind for helping us with this through a \$500 sponsorship. We plan to conduct our first public meeting soon. Stay tuned for details!

And in the meantime, let's all keep up the good work of being active resource recovery warriors in our own patch.
