#### Dear Parents/Caregivers,

Thank you all sincerely for your incredible efforts in RAT Kit testing your children twice weekly! COVID-19 seems to be steadily creeping into our school, mostly via secondary settings and workplaces. By using the RAT Kit tests twice weekly, it gives us all the opportunity to be forewarned and to be prepared for a possible 'positive'.

Please notify the school if you have a positive or if your child will be away for the required 7 days as recognised household close contacts. We will forward home some learning activities for your child to engage in if they are well enough. I've started forwarding home, via email, a copy of the Exposure Notifications letter so that you are aware of infections across the school. As of today, there are ... active cases in the school. Hard Copies of the Exposure Notifications letter will also continue be forwarded home to the classes effected, as required by the Dept. of Education. (DET)



Public Health and Wellbeing Regulation 2019 -Minimum period of exclusion from primary schools and children's services for infectious diseases cases and contacts:

Exclude until all blisters have dried. This is usually at least 5 days after the rash appears in unimmunised children but may be less in previously immunised children.

Any child with an immune deficiency should be excluded for their own protection.

\*In 2022 we have a junior year-level student who is anaphylactic to NUTS!

We will need to be a <u>NO NUTS school</u>, as our students mix with and play with each other across the school day. Our junior school Buddies will also meet for learning activities with our senior school Buddies. Thank you sincerely for considering the safety of our students as you choose what food is placed in your child's daily snack and lunch box.

\*In 2022 we have a senior year-level student with a medical need that requires us to know immediately when there is Chicken Pox or a similar illness about. Please contact the Office as soon as you are aware. Again, thank you sincerely!

## Performing Arts:

This term in Performing Arts, we are focusing on singing and drama games and role play. In the junior classes, the Learning Intention is for the students to learn and practise call and response songs as well as fun actions to go along with their lyrics. The drama games revolve around developing listening and responding skills and of course, fun! We begin each session with special breathing exercises to get our bodies and voices ready for singing. The juniors have special 'breathing buddies' to help them know when their lungs are expanding and to help them feel calm and focussed. They are practising singing as a group and their voices sound amazing!

In the senior grades, the Learning Intention is for the students to develop their capacity to sing songs which include harmonies as well as songs from different cultures. They also begin each session with breathing exercises and have learned the physical ways in which singing can be beneficial to our health and wellbeing. They sound incredible when they sing their songs and are practising performing as a choir in readiness for a performance, hopefully sometime next term! The seniors are also engaging in drama games, including improvisation role play and other theatre sports. Students have assisted our parent volunteers in planting out the front two garden beds and working on improving the soil. We are looking into some new ideas to help us better compost our food scraps and have submitted an application for a Woolworths-Landcare grant. If successful, this will go towards vermin proof compost bins.

Christy and Kris held a very popular Seed bomb making workshop at lunch time with each participant making their own clay seed bomb to take home once dry. We can't wait to hear about the flowers that grow from them later in the year!

#### Nashi Salad

#### Salad

2 small oak lettuces -Leaves torn

1/2 cup spinach leaves

1 large cucumber -thinly sliced

2-3 Nashis -thinly sliced

½ block feta -chopped into cubes

½ cup croutons

#### Dressing

1/2 Tablespoon red wine vinegar

1 Tablespoons Maple syrup

1 Tablespoons mustard

2 Tablespoons olive oil

Shake ingredients together in a sealed jar or container.

Drizzle over salad and toss through.



#### Apple Turnovers

(makes 26 pieces)

#### Ingredients

- 6 sheets puff pastry frozen puff pastry\*, cut into quarters
- 6 large apples (finely diced)
- 3 Tablespoons Lemon Juice
- 1 ½ Teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 3 Tablespoons Flour\*
- 3 Tablespoons Sugar
- 3 Tablespoons Brown Sugar

#### Method

Preheat oven to 180°C and thaw pastry sheets on the kitchen counter for 10 minutes.

Toss diced apples with lemon juice, cinnamon, flour, and sugars and set aside. Slice each sheet of pastry into quarters. Spoon approximately 1 tablespoon of the apple mixture into the centre of each square, leaving a 2cm border around the edges.

Fold the square over into a triangle, and press the edges firmly together using the end of a spoon in a decorative pattern.

Bake for 15 minutes until golden brown and serve warm.

\*Can substitute for Gluten free flour and pastry





#### **Baked plums**

#### Ingredients:

- 4 plums
- 1 Tbs Honey or Maple syrup
- 1/2 Tbs Brown sugar
- ¼ tsp Cinnamon

Yoghurt and Muesli to serve.

#### Method:

Preheat oven 220°C

Cut fruit in half and use a teaspoon to safely remove seeds.

Cut off any bruises or blemishes.

Place halves skin side down in a dish.

Sprinkle sugar and cinnamon over fruit then drizzle honey over.


Bake at for 220°C for approximately 15 minutes.

Allow to cool for a few minutes.

Serve with yoghurt and muesli.

Or as a dessert, serve with ice-cream and crumble.

Each morning your kilometres will be recorded by our Sports House Captains. So join in the fun and invest in you health and wellbeing!

## There is a Prize for the student who travels the most kilometres.

'Walk to School' on Tuesday morning counts for  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a kilometre (500meters) for those that come along. Join us at Queens Park at 8.25am and walk up to school. Students may also like to walk multiple laps around the oval loop each morning before school starts.

1 lap of the large oval loop = .5 of a kilometre (500metres)

1 lap of the **small oval loop** = .3 of a kilometre (300metres)
