Our third term of the 2022 school year has been a very busy and productive one! Apart from a lot of illness related absences we have almost enjoyed a 'regular' term.

Thank you all for your commitment to our wonderful school and to the ongoing learning successes for our students.


This term began on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> July. Our senior school students attended a Day 1 excursion to the Art Gallery of Ballarat. A NAIDOC Week focus. Some of the incredible ochre paintings remain at the Gallery, and we still have some on display in the foyer here at school. Our displays will be updated over the School Holiday break. Across Term 3 we also:

- Celebrated weekly Students of the Week!
- Conducted weekly Student Leadership Meetings with our School Captains and Vice School Captains.
- Our Choir group conducted regular lunchtime sessions.
- Mrs Vicki Anderson attended Literacy Leaders training. Staff have engaged in further Literacy and Numeracy based in-house and external online professional learning. We continue to lead the way within the Central Highlands as a pilot school in the implementation of the Marrung indigenous education Strategy. Thank you for allowing us a Student Free Day on Day 1 of next term so that we can extend our learning further, particularly in the area of Cultural Responsibility. We will also

- undertake our refresher First Aid Training. Mr James has continued with EMU and QuickSmart and we have welcomed Mrs. B back in, a volunteering capacity, to support students in Reading Intervention.
- Mrs Anderson has thoroughly enjoyed working with students in Year 1 and Year 2 in the Tutor Learning Inititive sessions.
- Mrs Anderson has also been externely proud of the five Year Five and Year Six students that were selected by the Dept to engage in the twice weekly Victorian High Ability Program (VHAP), in Literacy. Next term, six students have been selected, in both Literacy and Numeracy VHAP.
- We continued to use fundrasing money to support our very successful 'home grown' Kitchen Garden & Cooking program with Mrs Mitchell.
- Mr Lewis supported his Term 3 group with the very successful and highly valued DRUMBEAT program. There will be a whole school Assembly performance at the beginning of Term 4.
- Mr Lewis and dedicated helpers continued with a very positive weekly Breakfast Program on both Thursdays and Fridays.- thanks Mr. Lewis & Helpers!
- Eligible families continued to receive support from the CSEF funding- supporting Camps, Excursion and Incursion opportunites for our students. Multiple Grants success have also meant that there have been significantly less costs for these extra-curricular events for all families in 2022. Additional funding from the Education Dept will see a reduced cost of Swimming for every participting child in Term 4.
- The Year 3 and Year 4 students loved their Log Cabin Camp experience! So did the participating teachers!
- 2 x Junior School Council Meetings were conducted incorporating Student Voice and Student Agency into decision making within the school. This term this now includes a Hot Dog Day fundraiser linked to Footy Day and we will thoroughly enjoy this day tomorrow!
- Results of the annual DET Student Attitudes to School Survey (ATSS) were returned after the years 4, 5 and 6 students were surveyed earlier in the year. Overall, our school has very positive data once again! Our student leaders have analysed the data. Next term our students will assist with further analysis and then will make a small presentation to their class on the findings. Following class feedback, the school will take action to ensure ongoing improvement.
- The ATSS data was also presented to staff and will be presented to School Council at the October Meeting. It will then be made public via the My School website and in our Newsletter.
- Staff actively participated in OH & S components of Staff Meetings, keeping the safety and wellbeing of all, foremost in our minds. On behalf of the OH & S Committee, the school completed an OH & S 'Intruder' drill with all students. We are formally recognised as being Grass Fire 'at risk'. This will be an ongoing focus leading into our Bush Fire season. Our school will close on CODE RED days.
- National NAPLAN Online assessment results were returned with pleasing growth results in Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation, and Numeracy. The data was presented to student leaders and staff, and will be presented to school council and parents via the Newsletter early in Term 4. The data is also available via the My School website.
- All parents and carers were selected to participate in the annual, now online, Parent and Carers Opinion Survey. This closes tomorrow. So far our participation % is down, so please consider completing the Survey urgently.
- We thoroughly enjoyed the "Pinocchio" incursion at school, fully funded, by Regional Arts Victoria.
- The Wesley Music Performance, held this term up at the Bluestone, was very engaging! Thank you Wesley @ Clunes! Wesley students also supported our literacy lessons on Fridays in P/1D and 1/2MI
- 3 x engaging and proactive School Council Meetings were conducted. Our Term 3 Working Bee achieved much and we already have a long list of tasks to achieve at the early in Term 4 Working Bee, in readiness for bush fire season.
- Six of our students did extremely well in the District Athletics and two students will now go on to compete at a Regional level next term
- Our whole school participated in a Children's Book Week Focus Day with a delightful Book Parade showcasing the efforts of our parents to dress up their children as their favourite book character. As usual our own Clunes Library supported us with engaging activities, this year, for three classes.

- Schools Tree Day was celebrated with extra trees planted in the school yard by a small group of interested students. Our Native edible Plants session has been postponed twice, due to illness and wet weather but has been rescheduled again for Week 3 Term 4.
- Our Parent/ Fundraising Group once again provided incredible fundraising support with the Tree Drive, yummy Hot Lunch Day, delightful Father's Day gift arrangement, 10kg Block of Chocolate Raffle fundraiser, and very popular canteen at the Term 3 Disco.
- The Term 3 Disco was, (as usual), a delightful event for both the Juniors and the Seniors!
- The school appointed Jamie Stevens to replace Luke Vermaas as our school's IT Tech.
- We reviewed and re- affirmed our class and yard rules with our students in line with our School Values and Positive Behaviours approaches. Next term we will seek feedback from the school community in regards to our Student Code of Conduct.
- In this last week of term:
  - Our Years 4-6 students have participated in the Major Games activity day at Daylesford. A gloriously sunny day!
  - Our entire school travelled to the Arts Centre in St. Kilda Road, via coach, to experience all that is the centre of our capital city, and to thoroughly enjoy the Flying Fruit Fly Circus performance "Girls with Altitude". This event was fully funded by the First Call grant.
  - Students will adorn their favourite footy colours for tomorrow's parade and will bring in 'coins' to line up for their footy team as a fundraiser and fun way to end the term. We will let you know of the result next term.

This is a great way to re-cycle and re-use uniform your children outgrow to benefit other students.


