

Cash and card (EFTPOS machine) are available.


The Book <u>Fair</u> is located in the Performing Arts room (the junior building, nearest to the staff car park). Follow the signs or ask at the office if you are unsure.

### SCHOOL GROUND NEWS

You may have already started to notice a few changes, new additions and maintenance works being carried out throughout the School in Term 4. Over the holidays, we commenced the major maintenance works to our buildings, starting with the moss removal and cleaning of the slate roof on the main building. We will be carrying out more work, repairs and painting, to the building throughout the term and over the Christmas break.

Due to the enormous rainfall we have experienced this year, we have been forced to make repairs to damages caused by the rain (both inside and outside the School). While the internal repairs will require more complex and costly work, improvement and upgrades to the Sensory Garden Play Space (Junior Playground) will commence to ensure water is redirected from the school grounds and to prevent the flooding and damage we have experienced, in the future. We will also top-up the granite sand footpaths and mulch the play/soft fall areas.

We are very excited to have recently completed yet another stage in our Kitchen Garden Area Project. Last term we took delivery of our new greenhouse. With thanks to Jesse Clowes and his freight team, the greenhouse arrived safely at school, ready to be installed at our Term 3 Working Bee. We thank everyone involved in the process; from sourcing right through to the installation. We would also like to sincerely thank the Sacco family for their very generous donation of the new garden shed, installed by Peter Sacco and Matt Bright over the Term 3 holidays. The addition of these two spaces will provide more immediate hands-on opportunities and enrich the Kitchen Garden and Cooking Program for students. The Kitchen Garden Project (which also includes our focus on native edible plantings), the fitting out of both sheds, and an irrigation system for the greenhouse, has been made possible through our success in obtaining 2022 grant monies from the Waubra Wind Farm.

We are very fortunate to receive Government funding for some of this work, however, there is considerable upkeep required with an historic building and extensive surrounds, and it can be a costly exercise. We have been very successful over the years with obtaining Government grants, but at times we have had to also rely on our fundraising money to support School Council projects. These projects are considered to be absolutely necessary for us to provide a safe environment for students, and to enhance and enrich their learning opportunities and outcomes. As a community, we are privileged to have inherited such a grand and historic learning space and icon, that being the original Clunes Primary School No. 1552 building and surrounds. It is our responsibility to maintain and preserve, the Main Building in particular, for future generations of Clunes and district children to be educated in, and enjoy this historic school.

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## Changes to COVID-19 isolation requirements

#### Dear parents and carers

You may be aware that the Victorian Government has announced changes to the COVID-19 isolation requirements.

This means that from 11.59pm on Wednesday 12 October, the mandatory orders around isolation for people with COVID-19 have ended and instead we move to health advice and recommendations for people with COVID-19 or COVID-19-like symptoms.

Our school will continue to adhere to the Department of Health's recommendations to ensure that our school remains a safe environment for our staff and students.

The Department of Health strongly recommends that students and school staff:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days and do not attend school after 5 days if they are still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive not attend school. This does not include students with preexisting conditions such as hay fever.

Parents and carers are recommended to continue to report their child having COVID-19 to both the school and the Department of Health.

We will, however, no longer report occurrences of positive cases to the school community.

We ask parents and carers to continue to remain vigilant in preventing COVID-19 transmission. Any student who is unwell should continue to remain at home. This is about keeping students healthy and well in our school and reducing the spread of both COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases.

Free rapid antigen tests are available at the school for those who need them.

Parents and carers will be contacted if their child shows symptoms while at school.

Students who wish to wear a mask should continue to do so.

To keep our school as safe as possible, we will also continue to use air purifiers and other COVID-19 prevention measures.

Thanks for your continued efforts to keep our school community safe and well.

#### Scholarships

Scholarships are available for eligible students in Grade 4 to Year 11, and for Year 12 students planning to undertake tertiary studies in 2023.

#### Student scholarships

The Department of Education and Training administers a number of scholarships that are available to eligible students who are currently enrolled in Grade 4 to Year 12 in 2022.

Applicants for these scholarships will be evaluated on their:

- participation in school activities
- community involvement
- academic record for the current year.

Scholarships are either one-off payments or cover the duration of the student's course or annual study.

Many of these scholarships have specific eligibility criteria so please refer to individual applications for more information. Applications are open and close on Wednesday 1 February 2023.

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### Thunderstorm asthma — be prepared this pollen season

Grass pollen season, which runs from October to December each year, brings an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms. It also increases the risk of <u>thunderstorm asthma</u>. For people with asthma or hay fever, especially those who experience wheezing or coughing with their hay fever, thunderstorm asthma can be sudden, serious and even life threatening.

Clunes Primary School will implement a range of measures to keep our school community safe when the risk of thunderstorm asthma increases.

Many of our staff are trained in asthma first aid, and we will monitor the VicEmergency app to receive thunderstorm warnings, and, where appropriate, keep students indoors when weather forecasts identify greater level of risk.

#### How you can prepare

During pollen season, there are some things you can do to prepare and protect yourself and your family:

- If your child has ever had asthma: talk to your doctor about what you can do to help protect your child from the risk of thunderstorm asthma, including updating your asthma action plan. Taking an asthma preventer properly and regularly is key to preventing asthma, including thunderstorm asthma.
- If your child has hay fever: see your pharmacist or doctor for a hay fever treatment plan and check if you should have an asthma reliever puffer. These are available from a pharmacy without a prescription.
- If your child has hay fever and experiences wheezing and coughing: it is important to make sure they don't also have asthma. Speak to your doctor about an asthma action plan.
- Where possible, avoid being outside during thunderstorms from October to December, especially during the wind gusts that come before the storm. Go inside and close your doors and windows. If you have your air conditioning on, turn it to 'recirculate'.

Protect yourself this pollen season – managing asthma and allergies matters.

#### Remain vigilant for COVID-19

It is important for students to manage any hay fever or asthma symptoms, as these conditions can produce symptoms such as fever, chills, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, and loss or change to sense of smell or taste, which are similar to COVID-19 symptoms.

If your child experiences these symptoms in different or worse ways to their usual hay fever or asthma symptoms, medical advice should be sought.
