Michael Lewis will return as our school Chaplain.


Jamie Stevens will return as our IT Technician.



Semester 2 Student Achievement Reports and 2023 class lists will go home on Tuesday 13th December 2022. (State-wide Transition Day)

Your kids will appreciate the right focus at report time

Could try harder... always does her best... lacks concentration...easily distracted...a pleasure to teach...

School reports can mean anxious times for children too. 'Will my parents be disappointed or proud?' is the main concern of most children. Kids of all ages take their cues from their parents, so your reaction to their school report can affect the way they see themselves as learners and as people.

Focus your attention on these aspects to make sense of children's reports:

Expectations

Expectations are tricky. If they are too high, then kids can be turned off learning. Too low and there is nothing to strive for. Pitch your expectations in line with a child's abilities. A quick check of your child's last report cards may give you a good yardstick.

Different rates of learning

Remember there are **slow bloomers**, late **developers** and **steady-as-you-go kids** in every classroom, so avoid comparing your child to siblings, your friends' children and even yourself when you were young. Instead, look for individual progress.

Safeguard confidence

Self-confidence is a pre-requisite for learning, so be prepared to be as positive and encouraging as possible.

Here are 5 ideas to think about before reading your child's report:

- **1. Look for strengths first**. Focus on strengths even if they are not in the traditional 3Rs or core subjects.
- **2.** Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort is below standard, then you have something to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, then you can't ask any more than that.
- 3. Broaden your focus away from academic performance to form a picture of your child's progress as a member of a social setting. How your child gets along with his or her peers will influence his happiness and well-being, as well as give an indicator to his future.
- **4. Take note of student's self-assessment**. Kids are generally very honest and will give a realistic assessment of their progress. They are generally very perceptive so take note of their opinions.
- 5. Discuss the report with your child talking about strengths first before looking at areas that need improvement. Ask your child how they performed and discuss their concerns.

Be mindful that no matter how good, bad or indifferent your child's report may be, he or she can wipe the slate clean and make a brand new start next year. And it's amazing the difference a summer holiday can make. Michael Grose





- 1. Sign into your Student account at https://app.seesaw.me.


 If you need a copy of the login, please speak with your child's teacher/s.
- 2. Tap your Profile Icon on the top left.




3. Tap Account Settings.

Staying safe from mosquitoes

After floods and heavy rainfall, mosquitoes can grow and spread in the pools of water left behind.

While the overall risk is low, some mosquitoes carry diseases that are spread through mosquito bites. Mosquitoes are more active at dusk and dawn, but some will also bite during the day.

The best way to prevent mosquito-borne diseases is to avoid mosquito bites.

Families can protect against mosquito bites by:

- covering up as much as possible with long, loose-fitting, light-coloured clothing
- applying insect repellent that contains picaridin or DEET on exposed skin when leaving home
- limiting outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are active.

SAFE BUS TRAVEL





Welcome on board. Enjoy. Be aware.

- Leave home with plenty of time to get to the bus stop 10 minutes prior to the scheduled departure time.
- Always walk as far away from the road edge as possible.
- Do not push others when the bus is approaching the stop.
- If you are using headphones these MUST be removed before leaving the bus as they distract you from being fully aware of danger.
- Make sure you always treat the driver with respect. They have the important job of getting me, you and others to school and home safely.



ROAD USERS - Please slow down and be aware around bus stops. Look out for the lights flashing on the outside of the bus, which means children are leaving or boarding the bus.

Do stand well back when at the bus stop and wait until the bus has completely stopped.





Never cross in front of the bus. Never cross the road until the bus has moved away.

Do wait until the bus moves well away and you can see clearly in both directions, before crossing the road.





Do sit down on your seat quietly and quickly. If there are no seats, move to the back of the bus and use the handgrips on the side.

PARENTS & CARERS - Parking or waiting opposite the bus stop is dangerous and is one of the most frequent causes of accidents at bus stops. All children, especially little ones, are excited to see you after a day at school and are likely to run across the road to meet you.

Please let me know if you require care (you don't need to be a working family to use this service, but working families have priority over care).

Holiday Program

I'm offering a few days of care each week during these 2 weeks of the January School Holidays, **9**th **to 12**th and **16**th **to 19**th **of January** (If I get the numbers). We are hoping to go Ten Pin Bowling in Ballarat, Movies in Maryborough, Horse Riding in Daylesford and Extreme Bounce in Ballarat.

Hours of operation will be 8am to 5.30pm, no part days. Excursions usually take place between 10am and 4pm, remainder of the time we are back at the school doing crafts, cooking, playing games, riding scooters, or just hanging out in the playground. Charges are your usual hourly rate x 9.5 hours care plus excursion costs. We use the Daylesford FDC Bus, it fitted with appropriate seatbelts and booster seats as required.
