Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome back to Term 3 everyone!

Dogs are no longer permitted on the grounds at Clunes Primary School

You will have read in the Clunes News recently that it is with a heavy heart that our school council has had to make the sad decision to no longer allow dogs in our school yard.

Why? As we prepare for school each day, we now have to also check our sand pits, tan bark and ovals to 'poop scoop' an increasing amount of uncollected dog waste. Students playing football, soccer and other games on the ovals stop their play to seek teacher assistance, again because of uncollected dog waste.

We can no longer have our chickens free roam after school hours as we fear for their safety. We sadly lost "Hattie" last year after she was mauled. Our school cat "Fluffy" is now at least safe as she has just retired to Val's house. Our students, all visiting families, and staff, should be able to walk around, ride their bikes, and / or play in the school yard after school hours without the fear of large, barking and sometimes aggressive dogs bounding up to them, off -lead, and seemingly unsupervised. We've had many complaints.

We love dogs, and our Therapy Dog 'Indy' was absolutely treasured. When 'Eddie' is old enough, and trained, he too will support our school students, but enough is enough. Dog owners will now need to use the very nearby Dog Park, not our school.

NAIDOC Week in 4/5





A New Clunes Sports Centre?






What if Clunes' Football oval, netball

They then had to place buildings on their land and are currently exploring how to make and measure 3D shapes.

Later on this term they will explore making game timetables, canteen menus, average crowd sizes at sporting events and a myriad of other mathematics tasks

that relate to sport.

New Department of Education enrolment process for your child in Foundation (Prep) for 2024

The Department of Education has released a **new state-wide timeline and process** for enrolling in Foundation (Prep) for the 2024 school year.

If you have a child starting primary school in 2024, a new enrolment application will need to be completed by Friday 28 July 2023. (Please complete the new process even if you had already enrolled for 2024).

Information Packs including the new Enrolment process and Application Form will be delivered to the Clunes Pre-School this week. You will also be able to collect it from our School Office.

It is important to follow the state-wide timeline to enrol your child in Prep. Enrolling your child in line with the timelines allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.

Upcoming changes to NAPLAN reporting

Ahead of NAPLAN results for students being released from Monday 17 July 2023, I'm writing to inform you of some changes to this year's reporting. These are changes being introduced nationally by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA).

NAPLAN will continue to measure student achievement in numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, and grammar and punctuation but the results will now be presented in 4 proficiency levels:

These are:

- · Exceeding
- · Strong
- · Developing
- · Needs additional support.

This change will give schools, parents and carers clearer information that details student achievement against new proficiency levels.

Students' NAPLAN reports will continue to show how they are tracking against their peers and provide an indication of their skill levels against national averages and where we would expect them to be in order to get the most out of schooling. This provides valuable information to teachers about how we can continue to support your child.

Each set of NAPLAN results is an important milestone but it's also important that students know that one result does not define them – these results are about making sure every student gets the support they need so they can continue to get the best from their learning.

When we provide you with your results, you will also receive information about what the new proficiency levels mean.

As ever, you're welcome to speak to me, or your child's teacher with any questions about these changes.
