
VICSWIM Summer Kidz Program is a great way for your child to learn how to swim & stay safe in & around water!

This is a rare opportunity to be part of a circus in the pool. The show will be performed in Clunes pool and then will tour to Trentham and Newstead pools this summer.


We are looking for eager people aged between 8 and 17 to join a performance troupe.

Dear Parents,

The musical performances will be at <u>5.00</u> and at <u>7.30</u> on Thursday. The performance will be photographed by Marnie Tole and videoed by Paul Demunk , both professionals in their fields. We have paid for the rights to do this, so we ask that no photographs and phone videos be taken as the musical is hired under strict Copyright rules. The children will need to be dropped off at 4.00 o'clock at the side of the town hall (the kitchen door) for makeup and costuming. May I suggest that they have a substantial afternoon snack <u>before</u> they arrive. Years 3/4 and 5/6 come dressed in their beach gear which can include hat or cap and sunglasses. No thongs as the children are moving on stage and may trip.

All other children to follow the list already provided and wear the clothes that go under their costumes.

At the conclusion of the first performance the children will have a food break. We will supply the food, the menu is as follows:

Ham, chicken, cheese, cheese/ vegemite and vegemite sandwiches.

Apples, bananas and mandarins and water.

If your child has special food requirements please send the food with them so they can eat with the others.

We have already sent home a note that gave permission for your child to participate in the musical and alerted us to any problems in using makeup or coloured hairspray on your child. It is important that the notes are returned immediately so we know exactly what we can use on your child or to use nothing at all to avoid allergies to any of these products. If you require another copy of this note please let us know immediately.

We have asked for the children to arrive with a light layer of foundation as this will save us a lot of time, and we will mainly be adding a little blush and lipstick and colourful Zinc cream to our beach children.

The children can be picked up at the kitchen door by a parent at approximately 9.00pm. We will not be releasing children until we have a visual of you, as it is quite a chaotic time as you can imagine.

Tickets are still available at the office. The charge has remained the same for the last four performances as we only endeavour to cover the cost not to make any profit. The children are wonderful and I know you will all enjoy seeing them on the stage.
