## Do we have your mobile phone number?



## Contact details

There are times when we will need to contact you via text message or phone call, including on the day if your child is absent and you haven't informed the school about the reason for the absence. From the beginning of Term 3, our school will contact you as soon as practicable on the day a student is absent if information about the absence has not been provided. Do we have your most up to date contact details? If not, please communicate with the school as soon as possible so we can update our records.

Where you have provided a mobile phone number to the school in the past that is likely to be the number that will be used to contact you. If you see a text message from an unfamiliar number and your child is absent from school without an explanation please make sure you check the message. If we cannot reach you because we don't have your correct contact details (i.e. message notification fail, disconnected number) then we will make contact with any emergency contact/s nominated on your child's file held by the school, where possible, on the same day as the unexplained absence. If you would not like us to text your mobile phone regarding unexplained student absences please advise the school office as a matter of priority. In this situation an alternative method of contact will need to be provided.

Please remember to call the school on 5345 3182 early in the morning if your child is going to be away or late for school so your child's absence can be recorded correctly. Notification in advance of planned absences (e.g. family holiday/appointments) is strongly encouraged. You have a legal responsibility to ensure that your child attends school as much as possible. Increasing absences across the state are of concern to the Department of Education and they are knuckling down!

The Conferences went for approximately 15 minutes and each student was expected to be present at the Conference and to play a part in the conversation and feedback. 
