


CHAPLAIN'S CHAT

Make your compliments count

POSITIVE PARENTING

Ever notice how small hinges can swing really big doors? It's a reminder that it's the smallest things we do in our families that often have the biggest impact. One way you can maximise your impact on your family's wellbeing and your children's self-esteem is to make your compliments count. Here's a story about how a few well-chosen words had a huge impact on a child, with an explanation of how you can do the same.

Next time, your child does something worthwhile take the time to give a sincere compliment. Smile and add a little touch to really let them know how you feel. Watch your child's reaction.

I overheard a friend tell her eight-year old daughter last week: "You did such a good job helping your brother yesterday. You are such lovely big sister!". My friend's face was lit up with a big warm smile. At the same time, she gently put her hand on her daughter's shoulder as she spoke. The little girl beamed, and then happily went off to play. It was a simple parenting moment among many that my friend would have initiated that day.

I couldn't help thinking that it doesn't take much to nurture a child's self esteem and create good feelings at home. Compliments, when given sincerely, have an enormous impact on those who receive them. We all grow a little taller, at least inside, when we receive them. We also feel closer to the person giving them.

Compliments satisfy the deep craving we all have to be appreciated. They are easy to give, but they are also easy not to give.

We forget.

We underestimate their impact.

We haven't developed the habit of giving compliments.

There were two things my friend did that amplified the impact of the compliment. Firstly, she smiled as she gave it. Secondly, she touched her daughter as well. Touch will always amplify a compliment. It makes it personal.

Her mother's smile showed her daughter how her mum really felt. In fact, the touch and smile said it all. *The words justified the smile and touch*. The compliment was given and received through three senses – visually, kinaesthetically and auditory.

That's how kids will process all your messages – they see, they feel, they hear. We often focus on the words and forget the visual and kinaesthetic.

Next time, your child does something worthwhile take the time to give a sincere compliment. Smile and add a little touch to really let them know how you feel. Watch your child's reaction. I promise it will have a significant impact. It doesn't take much to touch their little hearts.

While head lice continue to cause concern and frustration for some parents, teachers and children, there are ways we can work together to help manage head lice.

Our school policy for managing head lice is outlined below:


- When head lice have been noticed in your child's class, a note is sent home with all children in the class letting parents know and requesting parents check their child's hair and if necessary, commence treatment.
- Children who have head lice are excluded from school until treatment has commenced. If head lice
 are noticed when your child is at school, families will receive a phone call from the school asking you
 to collect your child so he/she can be treated at home. <u>After treatment a child may return</u>
 immediately to school.
- Our school conducts head lice checks from time to time for those children who have permission. The diagram below shows the life cycle of head lice and just how long head lice will be present.

It is very important that treatment is commenced straight away and that daily checks are conducted and all eggs removed. Talk with your chemist or health centre about effective treatments.

HEAD LICE

While children are at school, many families will have contact with head lice. While head lice continue to cause concern and frustration for some parents, teachers and children, there are ways we can work together to help manage head lice. We hope the information provided in today's newsletter will help families treat and control head lice.


Werribee zoo

We got to have lots of different experiences such as, learning about different animal skulls and being taught the different structural adaptations of the animals that will help them survive in the wild. We also got to go behind the scenes and see the monkey's enclosure. We then got into small groups, once we did that the instructor handed us different behavioural adaptation objects (enrichments) and then we had to work out how they related to an object that might appear in their native habitat. We also got to go on a safari bus through the savannah. We learnt many new facts and in general it was a great day. Driver stopped at stop line for pedestrians on a children's crossing with children crossing flags



A friendly reminder for those who drive their children to school and for pedestrians who use the children's crossing.

Children's crossings are only in operation when flags are displayed.

When flags are displayed, drivers must not proceed through the crossing if children or adults are still on the crossing or about to start crossing.

This is the law regardless of the presence of a crossing supervisor.

When children's crossings flags are not displayed, pedestrians should give way to passing road traffic.

Drivers should always use caution when approaching children's crossings when children are present.

Bookings are not required. Turn up on the day




