


# Writing focus -Sentence structure

## C - Connectives

Connectives are used to join one part of a text to another. They can join thoughts, ideas, and paragraphs together to create flow within the text, and to add more detail. Connectives can be conjunctions, prepositions or adverbs. The simplest connectives to use are and, because and then. More complex ones are after, so, or, while and however.

- Try and search for connectives in the stories you are reading at home. See if you can use them in different sentences.
- Listen to the connectives your children are using in their speech and prompt with higher-level ones to extend their sentences.
- See if you can rearrange sentences to start with the conjunction.
- Give your child a connective to use in a sentence.

## INFORMATION AND ORDER FORM

The Clunes Primary School has organised a tree drive for this year as part of our fundraising for further planting and projects in the school grounds. Trees will be supplied directly from Valley Trees Nursery in Ardmona, who offer a wide range of quality fruit, farm and ornamental trees.

### Tree list:

Most trees are grafted, bare rooted and are 1.0 to 1.8 metres tall. Non-grafted, citrus and semi-advanced trees are listed separately. The supplier has listed the fruit varieties in order of maturity, however these are approximate only, as this can vary according to climate and locality.

We note that there is a wide range of trees available and it is up to the purchaser to research the attributes of the trees and whether it is suitable for a particular location.

### Pick up:

Orders will be available for pick up at in **late July**. We will contact you once they have arrived and you may come and collect them during set times (usually a Friday evening and the following Saturday morning).

Please make sure you put your phone number and email on the order form so we can contact you once the trees arrive.
