**Term 2 Working Bee!**

**Working Bee- this Sunday 8.30- 11am Tasks include:**

- jet wash the BER decking (left over task from last Working Bee) Jet Wash Cleaners required with plenty of hose and attachments
- Repair and reattach the net to the soccer goal
- Prune fruit trees
- Check marquees for repairs required. Check no. of marquee weights. Spray paint weights to identify them
- Clean out the storm water drains ready for Winter
- Flush out the down pipes ready for Winter
- Check for immediate build- up of leaves, dirt etc. in gutters either side of the staff room and remove waste
- Scrub out drinking troughs. Repair leaks
- Trim branches near the nth side of the junior sandpit
- Remove broken wooden seat near the P/1D door.
- Fill gap in concrete paving at the back of 5 /6B with blue metal or granite sand to prevent tripping hazard
- Weeding- front of school- in the stones at the main gate/ front garden beds
- Weeding-raised Garden beds at perimeter of Courtyard & in front of Staff Room windows + remove thorny rose vine in front of Staff Room window+ remove deadly nightshade weeds from paving and concrete edges

**Please bring the necessary tools and equipment**

- Plant new plants/flowers in the old rubbish bins
- Remove bulging weeds in the walking track in preparation for EB cart practice sessions/ fill cracks with granite sand
- Continue to spray/ whipper snip northern boundary
- Prepare the trailer in the Red Shed for future use
- Mulch the garden beds that include areas under the almond trees, the rounds of logs and near the mound near the Junior Playground


### Assembly

## INFORMATION AND ORDER FORM

The Clunes Primary School has organised a tree drive for this year as part of our fundraising for further planting and projects in the school grounds. Trees will be supplied directly from Valley Trees Nursery in Ardmona, who offer a wide range of quality fruit, farm and ornamental trees.

### Tree list:

Most trees are grafted, bare rooted and are 1.0 to 1.8 metres tall. Non-grafted, citrus and semi-advanced trees are listed separately. The supplier has listed the fruit varieties in order of maturity, however these are approximate only, as this can vary according to climate and locality.

We note that there is a wide range of trees available and it is up to the purchaser to research the attributes of the trees and whether it is suitable for a particular location.

### Pick up:

Orders will be available for pick up at in **late July**. We will contact you once they have arrived and you may come and collect them during set times (usually a Friday evening and the following Saturday morning).

Please make sure you put your phone number and email on the order form so we can contact you once the trees arrive.
