



Rubik's Club - Certificate and New Puzzles!!



Congratulations and well done to Isabelle on receiving her first Rubik's Cube certificate!

The method I use to teach students how to solve a Rubik's Cube, involves learning five different patterns/algorithms. One of those five patterns is used more often than the other four. When students can practise this particular pattern without any assistance, they, like Isabelle receive a special certificate, and are well on the way to solving the cube.

We have a lot of fun at our Rubik's Club, and we are especially excited this term, as during the recent holidays I purchased some new, exciting,.....and yes challenging Rubik's puzzles. These included a range of fruit that all function exactly like a normal 3x3 cube (except for the banana which is a 2x2x3). For our culinary puzzle delight we now have an apple, pear, lemons, peach, orange, banana, mirror cube, pyraminx, megaminx, master morphix, skewb, to all go along with our other puzzles of a 4x4 and 5x5 cubes, and quite a few 3x3's. I almost forgot to mention that for those who want to further test their puzzling skills, we also now have a special timer similar to what the likes of Australian speed cuber Feliks Zemdegs uses. Rubiks Club runs during Thursday recess and lunch.

New Department of Education enrolment process for your child in Foundation (Prep) for 2024

The Department of Education has released a **new state-wide timeline and process** for enrolling in Foundation (Prep) for the 2024 school year.

If you have a child starting primary school in 2024, a new enrolment application will need to be completed by Friday 28 July 2023. (Please complete the new process even if you had already enrolled for 2024).

Information Packs including the new Enrolment process and Application Form will be delivered to the Clunes Pre-School this week. You will also be able to collect it from our School Office.

It is important to follow the state-wide timeline to enrol your child in Prep. Enrolling your child in line with the timelines allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.



INFORMATION AND ORDER FORM

As part of our school's fundraising program, we are offering for sale a range of quality fruit, farm and ornamental trees sourced from a commercial nursery. Each tree purchased through the tree drive helps support Clunes Primary School.

Tree list:

Most trees are grafted, bare rooted and are 1.0 to 1.8 metres tall. Non-grafted, citrus and semi-advanced trees are listed separately. The supplier has listed the fruit varieties in order of maturity, however these are approximate only, as this can vary according to climate and locality.

We note that there is a wide range of trees available, and it is up the purchaser to research the attributes of the trees and whether it is suitable for a particular location.

Pick up:

Orders will be available for pick up in **late July or early August**. We will contact you once they have arrived and you may come and collect them during set times (usually a Friday evening and the following Saturday morning). Please make sure you put your phone number and email on the order form so we can contact you once the trees arrive.
