Apply Week 1 Term 2 2024 to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) for 2025

The Department of Education released a new state-wide timeline and process in 2023 for students enrolling in Foundation (Prep). This process will continue for the 2025 school year.

If you have a child starting primary school in 2025, an enrolment application will need to be completed by late July 2024.

Information Packs including the Enrolment process and Application Form will be delivered to the Clunes Pre-School at the beginning of next term. You will also be able to collect it from our School Office. It is important to follow the state-wide timeline to enrol your child in Foundation. Enrolling your child in line with the timelines allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.



ANZAC Day 2024

Mid-morning Service - 10.30am. All students are invited to participate. Please assemble in front of the RSL Hall at 10.30am in school uniform for our march towards the Cenotaph. We will line the street as a guard of honour for the formal march. We will then stand as a school group on the north side of the cenotaph.

Our School Captains and Vice-Captains will participate in the formal ceremony. A School Captain will read Stanza Three of the Ode and all four School Captains will lay a wreath on behalf of the school community.

Selected pieces of student writing (senior school) will be read at the ceremony by the authors. The chosen pieces for 2024 will be determined by the staff at the end of Week 1 next term. Their parents/ guardians will be contact before the end of Week 1. Selected pieces will be placed in the Term 2 Week 3 Newsletter.

A range of ANZAC Day Badges (\$1, \$2, \$5, and \$10, and \$3 bracelets and \$5 pens) will be available for sale at School at the beginning of next term.

Term 1 summary: Our first term of the 2024 school year has been an incredibly busy and productive one! Our Term 1 in 2023 was eleven weeks long and this year we managed to achieve all, and more, in eight and a half weeks! You should all celebrate this terrific feat! Are you tired though?
Thank you all for your incredible resilience and ongoing commitment to our wonderful school! Your positivity continues to be exemplary. We've, in partnership, continued to focus on the ongoing learning and

wellbeing successes of and for our students.

This term we have among other achievements:

- Celebrated a very positive enrolment start to the year with 102 students registered at our school on Census Day.

- Welcomed Brock and Chloe V as School Captains and Xavier and Dyllan as Vice Captains.

- Settled 12 Preps into primary education, all Preps now attending full time!

- Elected House Captains and Junior School Council representatives and conducted weekly Student Leadership Meetings.
- Sought Green Team and Sustainability/Kitchen Garden representatives from across the school and we began our 2024 Kitchen Garden and Cooking Program.
- Registered for Energy Breakthrough 2024!
- Celebrated weekly Students of the Week!

- Established our class and yard rules in line with our School Values and Positive Behaviours approaches.

- Completed the 2024 School Council election process. We welcomed back; Jo Henderson-Drife (President), Deb Bright (Vice-President), Andy Campbell (Treasurer), Jaqui Featherston, Rob Anderson, Val McNeight, Jesse Parker (Secretary), Ash Burke, Gill Jedwab (Community representative) and Malcolm Hull (Community representative). We welcomed new school councillor Ellen Moroney.
- All teaching staff members attended multiple professional learning sessions (in-house, via online platforms and as far away as Melbourne), particularly focussed on Numeracy outcomes and also including preparing for the NAPLAN 2024. When our national NAPLAN assessments were completed for our Year 3 & Year 5 100% of our students were able to participate!
- -The Tutor Learning Initiative commenced for identified students (currently across Senior School).
- We were able to fundraise \$743 at the Historic Vehicle (Truck) Show and \$2,400 at Book Town!
- Three senior students were selected by the Department of Education to participate in the Victorian High Ability Program, in Term 1, in Literacy.
- -We were successful with Creative Arts Victoria Grant, which will engage the 'Asking for Trouble' team in Term 3 for our Year 6 students and are currently applying for a Grant with the Waubra Wind Farm. (outcome unknown as yet)
- -7 families gave their all at a Working Bee! Several of our listed tasks were completed. (leaf matter in guttering and storm water pits an ongoing Autumnal challenge... and 'Fairy Grass' this year!)
- Completed our 2024 Annual Implementation Plan and draft 2023 Annual Report documents in line with Department of Education compliance requirements. The 2023 Annual Report is currently being revised by the Department and School Council and will be made public early in Term 2.

-We danced away at our Term 1 Disco led by our Junior School Council representatives.

- Our 2024 Harmony Day Mixed Groupings- Focus Day was deemed a wonderful success as was our Food Bank fundraiser "Food Fight". We will have a large display at school about the event. Over \$4600 was raised for Food Bank.
- -We conducted Term 1 3 Way Conferences and all but four families were able to attend. Thank you!
- -Our Department of Education Diverse Learner initiative participation came to an end after an 18-month commitment and fabulous professional learning for all teacher and Aides. We thank Regional Education Improvement Leader- Laura for her dedication to the role in supporting our staff and students to improve our students' learning and wellbeing outcomes.
- -Our Junior (Internal) Toilets upgrade is nearly finished! It will be ready to use on Day 1 of Term 2.
- Our school efficiently and resiliently managed the School Closure day due to the Beaufort district fires.





OPPORTUNITY FOR PROFESSIONAL CUSTOMISED MOUTHGUARDS

Central Highlands Rural Health (CHRH), in partnership with Dental Health Services Victoria (DHSV) are providing your members/students, who participate in a contact sport, the opportunity to invest in a customised mouthguard as a preventative health strategy for 2024.

The customised mouthguards, manufactured by a qualified Dental Prosthetist are available in club colours and will be ready for collection approximately 2 weeks after the impressions have been taken.

Eligibility and costs are as follows: Open to sporting participants of the Hepburn Shire

Age	Eligibility	Cost
12 and under	Must have a minimum of 4 front adult/permanent teeth	Free
13 – 17	A holder or dependant of a current Concession Card • Healthcare Card • Pensioner Concession Card	Free
18 and above	A holder of a current Concession Card • Healthcare Card • Pensioner Concession Card	\$31.00
13 and above	IF NOT a dependant or holder of a current Concession Card	\$180
	 Maybe eligible for a rebate if privately insured. 	

NOTE: ALL IMPRESSIONS WILL BE TAKEN IN BALLARAT

- 1. In the <u>first instance</u>, you are required <u>to register</u> with the Oral Health Department at CHRH on 5321 6580. If you are eligible, your <u>voucher</u> will then be sent to the Ballarat Denture Clinic.
- Once <u>registered</u> with the <u>Oral Health Department at CHRH</u>, you will be required to phone the Ballarat Denture Clinic on: 5331 6486 to arrange an appointment time for your impression in Ballarat. The BDC is located at 18 Raglan Street North, Ballarat.
- 3. You will be able to collect your mouthguard from CHRH Community Health and Wellbeing Centre within 7-14 days after your impression.
